

Faithful in All Things

Stewardship means: All that I am and all that I have belongs to God.

Yours, O LORD, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendor, for everything in heaven and earth is yours (1 Chronicles 29:11).

Faithful stewardship is using everything in my life to glorify God.

*Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful.
(1 Corinthians 4:2)*

There is a side of stewardship we know, but need to remember.

We are called to be faithful stewards of money.

*"A tithe of everything ...belongs to the LORD; it is holy to the LORD.
(Leviticus 27:30)*

On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made (1 Corinthians 16:2).

We are called to be faithful stewards of time.

My times are in your hands... (Psalm 31:15)

*...making the most of every **opportunity**, because the days are evil.
(Ephesians 5:16)*

We are called to be faithful stewards of talent.

Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms (1 Peter 4:10).

There is another side of stewardship we may not know and need to learn.

We can be faithful stewards of our limitations.

We can be faithful stewards of our weaknesses.

But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me... For when I am weak, then I am strong (2 Corinthians 12:9-10).

We can be faithful stewards of our suffering.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves have received from God (2 Corinthians 1:3-4).
