"So the Lord stirred up their spirit." Haggai 1:14

In my daily time with the Lord, I've been reading through the Minor Prophets. While in the book of Haggai, I came across something that resonated with me. In Haggai, a remnant of Jews have returned to Jerusalem from Babylon. They did so with the blessing of Cyrus, the Persian conqueror. At first, they were enthusiastic about rebuilding the Temple and reconstituting worship in Jerusalem.

Unfortunately, their work didn't please all their neighbors, and there was resistance. The resistors actually secured an order from the Persian court that all work at the Temple was to stop. The zeal of God's people was dampened, and they turned their focus to other things, including their own homes.

When King Darius came to power, he sought to establish good will with the Jewish people and lifted the ban on the construction of the Temple. Darius even went so far as to provide funding for the project. The problem was God's people had been away from worship and work on the Temple for so long that other interests had filled their lives, and they had little interest in rebuilding the Temple.

Tragically the people didn't realize what was happening to them. The further they moved away from worship and Kingdom work, the more the Lord allowed their other pursuits to come up empty. In grace, God sent the Prophet Haggai to help them see that they needed to return to worship and the Lord's work. In 1:5 we read, "Now therefore, thus says the Lord of hosts: 'Consider your ways.'"

When confronted by this call and challenge from the Lord, the people responded in obedience. Their reverence for the Lord was restored, and the Lord assured them of His presence. In 1:14, we find these important words, "So the Lord stirred up the spirit of Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and the spirit of Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and the spirit of all the remnant of the people; and they came and worked on the house of the Lord of hosts, their God."

We have certainly faced numerous things over the last couple of years that could dampen our spirits for worship and the Lord's work. When we get pulled away from worship and Kingdom work, life always seems to present other 'fillers.' Yet, when we reflect on what God's people were called to do, we realize that nothing satisfies or fills our lives like worshiping and serving the Lord. It is what we were created to do. I'm praying that the Lord stirs our spirits for worship and Kingdom work. I pray that the Lord would stir my spirit so that there is a renewed zeal for seeing Him glorified!
