Regathering this Sunday

As we look forward to regathering in worship this Sunday here are some reminders:

Doors will open at 8:30 for the 9:00 a.m. service. Doors will open at 10:30 for the 11:00 a.m. service.

Here are a few additional notes related to Sunday:

- 1. If you arrive at 10:30 and the doors aren't open, please be patient knowing that volunteers are working quickly to have the building as clean as possible for you. When the cleaning is complete, the front Sanctuary doors and Welcome Center doors will be propped open.
- 2. If you feel more comfortable wearing a mask, please know that it is perfectly appropriate to wear one while attending worship.
- 3. The offering will be collected at the end of the service when you are leaving the auditorium.
- 4. Families are encouraged to sit together.
- 5. We will have every other pew roped-off. Plan to leave some space between you and the next person.

Dear Church Family,

I'm thankful that things are beginning to open again. This has turned into one of the most difficult times in modern history. The virus and the ensuing restrictions have impacted each of our lives in some way. Fortunately, there are signs that the situation is gradually improving.

The unfortunate aspect of the slow progress is that our summer ministry activities will be impacted. We waited as long as possible to make a decision on these ministries in hopes that there might be a more rapid reduction of COVID cases. As you know, the context of VBS, Camp, and other trips are not conducive for any measure of social distancing. In fact, it would be virtually impossible to sanitize in a way that would mitigate COVID-19 exposure.

Here are the plans for summer ministries:

- Otter Creek June 7. Postponed to a possible later summer date.
- VBS June 8-12. Postponed to July 27-31.
- LEADNOW. Canceled
- Camp Weeks June 21-July 2. Postponed with the potential of rescheduling a couple of weekend camps in late summer or early fall.
- Kentucky July 11-17. Postponed with the potential of rescheduling for a weekend trip in late summer or early fall.

**Each of the postponed events will depend on the COVID situation at that time. Let's pray that things begin to improve more quickly so these ministries can take place later in the summer or early fall.

This has been and continues to be a challenging time. Yet, often when God slows our activity, it is so that we can better hear from Him. Moses heard from the Lord when he turned away from what he was doing to observe the burning bush. I pray that months from now, when things have greatly improved that each of us will be able to look back and see that our relationship with the Lord was deepened because of the extra time we devoted to spending with Him. May we, like the apostle Paul, value knowing Jesus above all things.

"Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in Him" (Philippians 3:8-9).
